ARC ARRA Update: ENERGY

- Loans, Tax Credits, Bonds
 - Clean Renewable Energy Bonds - \$1.6 B
 - Renewable Energy Loan Guarantee Program - \$6 B
 - Advanced Energy Manufacturing Credits - \$2 B
- Grants
 - Energy Efficiency and Renewable Energy (EERE) - \$16.8 B
 - State Energy Office - \$3.1 B
 - Weatherization - \$5 B
 - EE Block Grants - \$3.2 B
 - R&D and Demonstration - \$2.5 B
 - Advanced Battery Grants - \$2 B
 - Investment Tax Credit, Grant in Lieu

ARC ARRA Update: TELECOMMUNICATIONS

- \$7.2 billion available
- NTIA has \$4.7B / RUS has \$2.5B
 - Both agencies planning a Notice of Funds Availability (NOFA)
 - Both agencies considering three funding cycles
 - Regional workshops addressing the application process possible
 - Individual meetings replaced with a series of public meetings and written comments addressing approximately 100 questions in 15 categories
 - Six public meetings scheduled; two already taken place
 - States likely to play a strong role in this process, though state role has not yet been defined
- FCC opened a docket (GN Docket No. 09-29) to seek comment on the development of a comprehensive rural broadband strategy

ARC ARRA Update: EDUCATION

- Dept of Education formula funds include both pre-K thru 12 and Higher Ed
 - \$48.6 B State Fiscal Stabilization Fund (SFS)
 - 18.2% for education, public safety, other government services
 - Construction, renovation, repair of public schools, private colleges eligible
- Dept of Labor formula funds
 - Distributed to states by March 18
 - Webinar on Recovery Act funds for WIA
 - Monday, March 23
 - Time tbd
 - delivered through Workforce3 One (www.workforce3one.org)
- Look at ALL agencies and sources
 - Tax laws
 - HHS, EDA, Energy, NIH
- Don't wait for news, contact your state officials now.

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ARC ARRA Update: INFRASTRUCTURE

- HUD-\$13 B
 - 75% distributed to states & local communities
 - 25% awarded via competition in coming months
- CDBG
 - For housing and community development projects (including infrastructure and public facilities)
 - Priority – Projects ready to go
 - Relaxation of guidelines still under discussion, expect announcement soon

ARC ARRA Update: INFRASTRUCTURE

- EPA
 - Clean Water SRF- \$4 B; Drinking Water SRF- \$2 B distributed to states
 - Targeting disadvantaged communities
 - 50% of funds for subsidy
 - Negative interest loans, principal forgiveness to make program affordable to all communities.
 - 20% set-aside for “Green Project Reserve”
 - Energy/water, green infrastructure, environmentally innovative projects
 - Planning, design, equipment, construction
 - Stand-alone or part of larger project
 - On-lot systems qualify
 - Get on state EPA project lists now




ARC ARRA Update: INFRASTRUCTURE

- USDA Rural Development
 - Water and Wastewater Grants and Loans (\$968M grant/\$412M loan)
 - Rural Business & Cooperatives (\$20M grant/\$130M loan)
 - Rural Housing/Community Facilities (\$63M grant/\$67M loan)
 - Standard loan/grant provisions
 - Persistent poverty counties
 - “Green” project elements
 - Call State and/or District RD offices ASAP

ARC ARRA Update: INFRASTRUCTURE

- Economic Development Administration: (\$150 M)
 - “Sudden and severe economic dislocation and job loss”
 - New electronic application process – no more “invites”
 - Call EDA regional offices in Atlanta, Chicago, or Philadelphia
 - **For all infrastructure activities :**
 - Don’t wait – call funders to initiate projects
 - Consider efforts to expand scope of existing projects
 - Get pending projects ready to go ASAP
 - Move funded projects to construction NOW – to take advantage of bid climate
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- Energy
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ARC ARRA Update: HEALTH

- \$137 B in Recovery Act funds managed by the Dept. of Health and Human Services
 - \$3.3 B into states as grants for Medicaid
 - \$500 M for The Health Centers Program
 - \$155 M obligated to support 126 new health center sites
 - \$11.5 M (of the \$155M) into the Appalachian Region for 10 new sites
 - AL, KY-2, NC, PA-5, WV
 - \$340 M for increased services at CHCs; applications were due on March 16
 - \$1.5 B
 - Construction, renovation and equipment of existing health centers
 - Health Information Technology
 - NIH Funding
 - \$1 B for construction, improvement of research facilities
 - \$500 M for scientific research and equipment
