



Per Capita Income in Appalachia, 1999

Compared with the U.S. Average



Per capita income is a measure of the total personal income of an area divided by the resident population of the area. The percent of the U.S. average is computed by dividing the county per capita income by the national average and multiplying by 100.

Percent of the U.S. Average



U.S. average = \$28,546

Appalachian average = \$23,383
