Program Guidelines | Who Can NOT Apply

Eligible Local Governments must be in the 423-county Appalachian Region

The following entities are ineligible to apply:

- Local Public Authorities (including any public housing agency under the United States Housing Act of 1937);
- Special Districts;
- School Districts;
- Intrastate Districts;
- Councils of Government (Local Development Districts); or
- Any Other Agency or Instrumentality of a Multi–State, Regional or Intra-State Government.

Surveys and Evaluations

- Baseline Survey (first week of course)
- Post Course Evaluation (immediately following course completion)
- Second post-course Evaluation (six months following course completion)



Program Guidelines | Opportunities

Capacity Building Grant of up to \$50,000

Eligible Uses include, (but are not limited to):

- Hiring full or part-time employee or contractors
- Purchasing IT infrastructure or equipment
- Software Subscription
- Provide training for staff and/or elected officials
- Combination of any of the above

Ineligible Uses include construction or projects that do not serve or advance capacity building.

Appalachia's local governments are the backbone of economic and community development. With more federal funding available than ever, local governments need support to apply for these opportunities and leverage federal support to create lasting positive change.

READY Local Governments provides **no-cost training** to help local government official better identify, secure, manage, and implement federally funded projects.

Following completion of the training program, participants will be eligible for up to \$50,000 in funding (no-match required) to implement internal capacity ouilding protect to help them better serve communities.

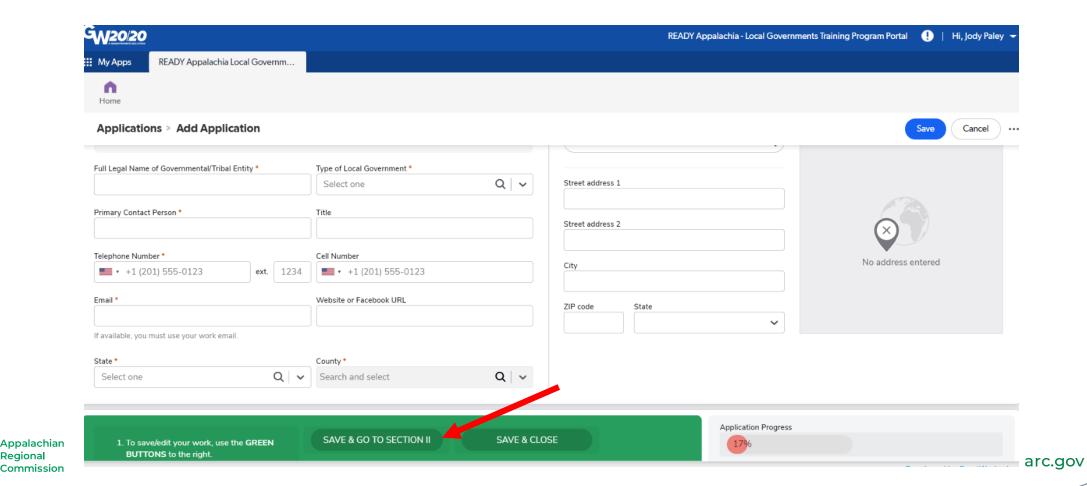





Weekly course instruction will occur from **April 29 - June 28, 2024**.

Please complete and submit the following form by THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 29, 2024, at 5:00 p.m. EST. For more information, please review the <u>Program Guidelines</u>. These guidelines are also available on the <u>ARC website</u>. The applicant's highest-level political or administrative official (e.g., mayor, city manager, etc.) must participate on behalf of the local government.

To begin your application, press the New Application button to the left. Please answer each question on the application as honestly and completely as possible. Applicants may save their work and return as needed. After you start an application, it will be displayed in the table below each time you return to the portal. Once your application is submitted, you may not make further edits to your application. The application can be completed on a mobile device (i.e. phone or tablet), however, a computer is recommended. Assessment & Selection Criteria

Assessment Criteria

- Assessment, discretionary and/or qualitative factors will be utilized in the evaluation of applications.
- Assessment criteria include:
 - Experience with federal grants and management;
 - Service of underserved groups and historically marginalized populations;
 - Alignment with ARC's five investment priorities;
 - Level of economic distress as a priority area for investment;
 - Inclusion in:
 - Rural Partners Network;
 - Interagency Working Group on Coal and Power Plant Communities; and/or
 - Distressed areas and census tracts.

Review and Selection Process

A designated ARC Review Panel will review and select participants based on the aforementioned eligibility and assessment criteria.
