



POWER Award Summaries by State

October 2024

Note: Hurricane Helene has impacted multiple Appalachian communities and grantees, including some POWER award recipients. ARC will continue working with affected state and grantee partners to address their needs as they recover and rebuild.

ALABAMA (1 award)

Project Title: *Training-to-Career Pipelines for Transitioning Service Members & Dislocated Veterans in Coal-Impacted Alabama*

Grantee: NextOp, Inc.

Award Amount: \$454,609

Announcement Date: October 2024

Project Summary: ARC grant of \$454,609 to NextOp, Inc. in Houston, Texas, for the *Training-to-Career Pipelines for Transitioning Service Members & Dislocated Veterans in Coal-Impacted Alabama* project. This project will provide outreach, recruitment, and wraparound support services, career assessment, training, job placement, and programming to help combat economic barriers experienced by the military/veteran (MIL/VET) population. It will also help meet the talent needs of local and regional employers across 15 counties and provide them with support services for integrating the MIL/VET population into civilian roles. Through partnerships with various employers, such as Aerojet Rocketdyne, AI Signal Research, Huntsville Hospital, Integration Innovation, Mazda, and others, NextOp will connect candidates with training programs, leverage local community colleges and vocational schools, and provide them with wraparound support and job placement services. As a result of this project, nine businesses will be improved through a new dedicated workforce pipeline; 15 communities will be improved through improved career pathways for veterans in the field of aerospace/defense, automotive manufacturing, cybersecurity, and healthcare; and 300 MIL/VET workers/trainees will be improved through placement in high-quality employment opportunities with regional employers.

KENTUCKY (11 awards)

Project Title: *Appalachian Center for Preventive Medicine (ACPM)*

Grantee: University of Pikeville

Award Amount: \$2,000,000

Announcement Date: October 2024

Project Summary: ARC grant of \$2,000,000 to the University of Pikeville in Pikeville, Kentucky, for the *Appalachian Center for Preventive Medicine (ACPM)* project. This project will serve as a platform for clinical education and guidance, providing essential experiences to ensure the success of undergraduate, graduate, and doctoral students as they progress through health, medicine, and wellness programs. Through interdisciplinary rotations at the ACPM, students will learn to improve the health outcomes of the region with preventative care. As a result of this project, 400 students will be improved through preventative healthcare education; four organizations will be improved through the ability to conduct preventative research; 15,000 patients will be improved through increased access to preventative healthcare; and 18 jobs will be created for local medical professionals.

Project Title: *Career Pathfinder Network*

Grantee: Eastern Kentucky Concentrated Employment Program, Inc. (EKCEP)

Award Amount: \$2,000,000

Announcement Date: October 2024

Project Summary: ARC grant of \$2,000,000 to Eastern Kentucky Concentrated Employment Program, Inc. (EKCEP), in Hazard, Kentucky, for the *Career Pathfinder Network* project. The project will place dedicated career counselors in five school districts within EKCEP's 23-county service area, where they will provide personalized career advising services and help connect students to career and employment opportunities, including work experience, internships, and pre-apprenticeship activities. By providing career exploration through work-based learning opportunities, Eastern Kentucky's young adults will have a better chance at finding viable career paths in the area. EKCEP anticipates 400 students will be served over the course of two years of this project.

Project Title: *Southeastern Kentucky Workforce Reintegration Program (WRP)*

Grantee: Volunteers of America Mid-States

Award Amount: \$2,000,000

Announcement Date: October 2024

Project Summary: ARC grant of \$2,000,000 to the Volunteers of America Mid-States in Louisville, Kentucky, for the *Southeastern Kentucky Workforce Reintegration Program (WRP)*. This project will provide skills and job training for in-demand industries, career planning, job and apprenticeship placement, and wraparound support services for unemployed or underemployed individuals in 15 counties. WRP will also provide access to a variety of specialized training programs including transportation, healthcare, technology, trades, and other industries based on the client's interests and hiring needs identified by local employers. As a result of the

project, it is anticipated that 500 workers/trainees and 150 businesses will be improved, while four jobs will be retained and three created.

Project Title: Southeast Transportation Center

Grantee: KCEOC Community Action Partnership

Award Amount: \$1,500,000

Announcement Date: October 2024

Project Summary: ARC grant of \$1.5M to KCEOC Community Action Partnership in Gray, Kentucky, for the Southeast Transportation Center POWER 2024 Initiative. The project will purchase and renovate an existing building and purchase training equipment for use by the Southeast Kentucky Community and Technical College to provide Commercial Driver's License and Diesel Mechanics training. The project will renovate 19,379 square foot building, develop 5 acres of site work, and serve 325 students over the two-year grant period

Project Title: *Nicholas County JEDA Business Park Waterline*

Grantee: Nicholas County, Kentucky

Award Amount: \$1,907,500

Announcement Date: October 2024

Project Summary: ARC grant of \$1,907,500 to Nicholas County in Carlisle, Kentucky, for the *Nicholas County JEDA Business Park Waterline* project. This project will install 7,500 linear feet of 12-inch waterline from the Nicholas-Bourbon County line to a new 100-acre business park in Millersburg, Kentucky. The new business park with rail and water service will aim to help attract a prospective biofuels company to the site and create new opportunities for local residents. This project will build 7,500 linear feet of 12-inch waterline serving 100 acres over the 12-month performance period.

Project Title: *Pathways to Power: Lineman and CDL Training Program in Southeast Kentucky*

Grantee: Southeast Kentucky Community and Technical College

Award Amount: \$1,633,164

Announcement Date: October 2024

Project Summary: ARC grant of \$1,633,164 to Southeast Kentucky Community and Technical College in Cumberland, Kentucky, for the *Pathways to Power: Lineman and CDL Training Program in Southeast Kentucky* project. The project will establish two new training programs to help students develop skills and certifications for sustainable careers across four counties in Southeast Kentucky: a commercial driver's license (CDL) program to train the next generation of professional truck drivers; and a lineman program to prepare individuals to install, operate, maintain, and repair electric power lines and cables. The programs, which are expected to serve 372 students, will also help strengthen transportation networks and support reliable electricity in Southeast Kentucky.

Project Title: *Strengthening the Education-to-Career Pipeline for Eastern Kentucky Youth*

Grantee: Foundation of Appalachian Kentucky

Award Amount: \$1,499,740

Announcement Date: October 2024

Project Summary: ARC grant of \$1,499,740 to Foundation of Appalachian Kentucky in Hazard, Kentucky, for the *Strengthening the Education-to-Career Pipeline for Eastern Kentucky Youth* project. The project will identify localized career pathways for gainful careers, including healthcare, technology/cybersecurity, and entrepreneurship, and connect students to them with comprehensive and coordinated work-based learning programs and career training curriculum. Impacting 11 counties, the project will provide opportunities for youth to engage in their futures and communities through professional development. Foundation for Appalachian Kentucky anticipates 450 workers/trainees and 75 businesses will be served by this project.

Project Title: *Fueling Innovation, Revitalization, and Entrepreneurship (FIRE) Program*

Grantee: Big Sandy Area Development District

Award Amount: \$400,000

Announcement Date: October 2024

Project Summary: ARC grant of \$400,000 to Big Sandy Area Development District in Prestonsburg, Kentucky, for the *Fueling Innovation, Revitalization, and Entrepreneurship (FIRE) Program*. This project aims to strengthen and fill gaps in the entrepreneurial ecosystem in Floyd, Johnson, Magoffin, Martin, and Pike counties with hands-on mentorship, technical assistance, and other services for current and aspiring entrepreneurs and small business owners. The project will serve five communities and 200 businesses, improving five communities and 150 businesses during the three-year grant period.

Project Title: *Community Assessment Tool for a Just Transition in Eastern Kentucky*

Grantee: PLACE Initiative

Award Amount: \$50,000

Announcement Date: October 2024

Project Summary: ARC grant of \$50,000 to PLACE Initiative in Portland, Oregon, for the *Community Assessment Tool for a Just Transition in Eastern Kentucky* project. The grantee will test and refine a Community Assessment Tool, which aims to help four counties in Eastern Kentucky transition away from a coal-powered economy to a more sustainable, diverse economy. The project will produce the report over the course of one year, and four counties in Eastern Kentucky will be served and improved.

Project Title: *Connections to Care—Assessing Long-Term Care Broadband Infrastructure in Eastern Kentucky's Coal Counties*

Grantee: LeadingAge Kentucky

Award Amount: \$49,500

Announcement Date: October 2024

Project Summary: ARC grant of \$49,500 to LeadingAge Kentucky in Louisville, Kentucky, for the *Connections to Care—Assessing Long-Term Care Broadband Infrastructure in Eastern Kentucky's Coal Counties* project. This project will conduct a needs assessment and create a feasibility report on the need for adequate broadband infrastructure in long-term care (LTC) facilities in nine counties in Eastern Kentucky. The grantee expects to learn more about the broadband challenges facing both for-profit and non-profit LTC facilities and create solutions to improve broadband access among LTC facilities. This project will collect data over 12 months and prepare one feasibility report on expanding broadband infrastructure in Appalachian Kentucky's LTC facilities.

Project Title: *Career Readiness/Internship Program Expansion*

Grantee: Saint Vincent's Mission, Inc. (SVM)

Award Amount: \$40,000

Announcement Date: October 2024

Project Summary: ARC grant of \$40,000 to Saint Vincent's Mission, Inc. (SVM) in David, Kentucky, for the *Career Readiness/Internship Program Expansion* project. The project will enable the grantee to conduct an evaluation and prepare an evidence-based strategic plan to expand and improve the existing Career Readiness/Internship program, which provides on-the-job training and workforce support services to unemployed and underemployed adults, college students, and disadvantaged high school students in economically distressed Floyd, Johnson, Knott, Magoffin, and Pike counties. This planning grant will allow SVM to hire a workforce navigator to evaluate the program and develop a needs analysis survey to identify more effective pathways for employing disadvantaged persons. The project will also strengthen the partnership with regional industry leaders to better understand local business and workforce needs. It is anticipated that by the end of the one-year grant period, one strategic plan will be developed that will inform a future implementation project to expand the Career Readiness/Internship program.

MISSISSIPPI (1 award)

Project Title: *Health Sciences Expansion—Scooba Campus*

Grantee: East Mississippi Community College

Award Amount: \$877,202

Announcement Date: October 2024

Project Summary: ARC grant of \$877,202 to East Mississippi Community College (EMCC) in Scooba, Mississippi, for the *Health Sciences Expansion—Scooba Campus* project. The multi-year plan includes construction of a new career technical facility, modernizing existing the health science facility, and expanding program offerings.

EMCC will build on its well-established health sciences programs with the addition of a new associate nursing degree program, equipment, and two nursing faculty members, helping to expand the local pipeline for nursing opportunities and provide a nursing program option more easily accessible for students in Lowndes and Kemper counties. It is anticipated that 150 students will be served as a result of this project.

NEW YORK (3 awards)

Project Title: *Ripley Interstate Shovel-Ready Site (RISRS)*

Grantee: Chautauqua County Industrial Development Agency

Award Amount: \$1,999,999

Announcement Date: October 2024

Project Summary: ARC grant of \$1,999,999 to the Chautauqua County Industrial Development Agency (CCIDA) in Jamestown, New York, for the *Ripley Interstate Shovel-Ready Site (RISRS)*. This project will address local infrastructure needs with a new access road to 147 acres in Ripley, which will be transformed into a shovel-ready site for water, sewer, gas and communications utilities. The project will support construction of 3,075 linear feet (LF) of access road, including a new left-turn lane that leads into the access road. 3,090 LF of 12-inch water main, 3,025 LF of 12-inch gravity sanitary sewer, 3,115 LF of natural gas main, and 3,040 LF of telephone and communication lines will be built along the access road and throughout the site. When complete, the utilities site expects to draw \$60 million in private investment and create 320 jobs.

Project Title: *"Jobs That Pay"—Building a Highly Skilled Workforce to Support the Heavy Equipment and Trucking Industries*

Grantee: The Research Foundation for the State University of New York, Alfred

Award Amount: \$1,998,370

Announcement Date: October 2024

Project Summary: ARC grant of \$1,998,370 to The Research Foundation for the State University of New York, Alfred, in Alfred, New York, for the *"Jobs That Pay"—Building a Highly Skilled Workforce to Support the Heavy Equipment and Trucking Industries* project. This program will create a pipeline of qualified workers in the heavy equipment industry in Allegany, Cattaraugus, and Chautauqua counties by raising awareness of heavy equipment jobs among middle and high school students and experienced workers; expanding capacity for hands-on learning; and expanding enrollment in micro-credentialing programs for workers. Over the course of three years, it is anticipated that 100 students will graduate with an Associate of Occupational Studies degree in heavy equipment operation or trucking and diesel; 2250 middle and high school students will learn about careers in heavy equipment operation or trucking and diesel; and 276 workers will earn a micro-credential in heavy equipment operation or trucking and diesel.

Project Title: *Electric Technology Training Center Planning Study in Delaware County*

Grantee: Delaware County Electric Cooperative, Inc.

Award Amount: \$50,000

Announcement Date: October 2024

Project Summary: ARC grant of \$50,000 to Delaware County Electric Cooperative, Inc. in Delhi, New York, for the *Electric Technology Training Center Planning Study in Delaware County* project. This project will develop a plan for a new electric technology training center for displaced workers, addressing the local need for a skilled new workforce in the electric technology industry. The project will produce a plan for the training center over the course of one year.

NORTH CAROLINA (2 awards)

Project Title: *EBCI Tannery Planning*

Grantee: Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians (EBCI)

Award Amount: \$50,000

Announcement Date: October 2024

Project Summary: ARC grant of \$50,000 to the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians (EBCI) in Cherokee, North Carolina, for the *EBCI Tannery Planning* project. The project includes conducting a feasibility study for a tribal tannery operation. The study will include an environmental analysis of the impact of a tannery facility, an economic analysis of the meat processing byproduct market, a needs analysis for entrepreneurs and skilled employees producing tanned goods, and a cultural report on the use of tanned materials in Cherokee history as a means of cultural preservation and regional tourism development. The project will produce a plan to help EBCI leverage a unique opportunity to restore a source of local materials for a long-standing, environmentally sustainable, business-focused cultural practice.

Project Title: *Supply Chain Study to Attract Advanced Manufacturing*

Grantee: Mayland Community College

Award Amount: \$35,000

Announcement Date: October 2024

Project Summary: ARC grant of \$35,000 to Mayland Community College in Spruce Pine, North Carolina, for the *Supply Chain Study to Attract Advanced Manufacturing* project. The project includes a study that will identify ways to grow the supply chain and support the extraction of high-purity quartz in Spruce Pine, which is the only known source of high-purity quartz in the world. High-purity quartz is used in a variety of products including semi-conductor chips, solar panels, fiber optic wiring, and nearly all technology requiring a computer chip. The study will identify key industries that can successfully relocate to Western North Carolina and will assess local workforce capacity and needs to support those industries in 17 counties. The project will produce an economic development strategic action plan centered on growing the high-purity quartz supply chain over the course of the 12-month performance period.

OHIO (8 awards)

Project Title: *Jefferson County Broadband Connectivity*

Grantee: Jefferson County Board of Commissioners

Award Amount: \$2,500,000

Announcement Date: October 2024

Project Summary: ARC grant of \$2,500,000 to Jefferson County Board of Commissioners in Steubenville, Ohio, for the *Jefferson County Broadband Connectivity* project. This project aims to improve broadband speeds in the townships of Springfield, Ross, Knox, Island Creek, Salem, and Wayne in Jefferson County by establishing public-private partnerships with internet service providers (ISPs) who can provide broadband as a service (BaaS) to project investment areas that do not meet Federal Communications Commission (FCC) benchmarks for broadband internet download and upload speeds. Through these partnerships, these areas will be served with 100/100Mbps symmetrical upload and download speeds. This project will serve approximately 34 businesses, 769 households, and six communities and will improve approximately 26 businesses and 575 households across six communities over the course of the seven-year performance period.

Project Title: *Shawnee State University Advanced Manufacturing Center: An Investment in Our Future*

Grantee: Shawnee State University

Award Amount: \$1,999,092

Announcement Date: October 2024

Project Summary: ARC grant of \$1,999,092 to Shawnee State University in Scioto, Ohio, for the *Shawnee State University Advanced Manufacturing Center: An Investment in Our Future* project. The project aims to strengthen the advanced manufacturing workforce in 10 counties in Southern Ohio and Northeast Kentucky with the renovation of a training center housed at Shawnee State University. It will also fund costs related to Manufacturing on the Move, a K-12 career exploration program designed with local employers to ensure alignment with industry demands so that participants can develop the skills required for employment. This project will serve 3,400 students, improve 3,350 students, serve 12 businesses, improve eight businesses, and renovate 8,700 square feet over the span of three years.

Project Title: *Rising Tides Initiative*

Grantee: Youngstown Business Incubator (YBI)

Award Amount: \$1,795,000

Announcement Date: October 2024

Project Summary: ARC award of \$1,795,000 to the Youngstown Business Incubator (YBI) in Youngstown, Ohio, for the *Rising Tides Initiative*. This project will help position incumbent manufacturers located in Ashtabula, Belmont, Columbiana, Jefferson, Mahoning, Monroe, and Trumbull counties for entry into the microchip, advanced energy, defense, and aerospace industries. Rising Tides will provide existing manufacturers with comprehensive technology education, impactful pilot/demonstration programs, federal research support and other targeted initiatives to enhance manufacturer competitiveness. Rising Tides will also support

emerging companies currently incubating in two regional technology incubators: Youngstown Business Incubator, focused on business software and advanced manufacturing technologies, and BRITE Innovation Center, supporting electric vehicle mobility, battery storage, and grid infrastructure. This project is expected to improve 90 businesses and 180 workers/trainees, create two new businesses and 20 new jobs, and leverage \$9,050,000 in private investment.

Project Title: *Appalachian Educator EmPOWERment Consortium*

Grantee: Ohio Valley Educational Service Center

Award Amount: \$1,750,000

Announcement Date: October 2024

Project Summary: ARC grant of \$1,750,000 to Ohio Valley Educational Service Center in Cambridge, Ohio, for the *Appalachian Educator EmPOWERment Consortium* project. The project will address the teacher shortage facing Southeastern Ohio with the development of an innovative model of teacher education, providing an affordable and accessible pathway to licensure for aspiring teachers. The project will first provide the "right 30" College Credit Plus (CCP) credits in teaching to high school students and facilitate their apprenticeship within member school districts in 12 counties. The high school students will then enroll in community college as an affordable bridge to a four-year institution, where they will complete their bachelor's degree in education and two-year paid apprenticeships in member school districts. The project expects to train and retain 27 qualified educators, who will go on to teach 675 students in Appalachian Ohio.

Project Title: *Building a Skilled Workforce Partnership to Accelerate Methane Reduction in Ohio*

Grantee: Ohio Natural Energy Institute

Award Amount: \$50,000

Announcement Date: October 2024

Project Summary: ARC grant of \$50,000 to Ohio Natural Energy Institute in Pataskala, Ohio, for the *Building a Skilled Workforce Partnership to Accelerate Methane Reduction in Ohio* project. The project will develop a comprehensive training curriculum and strategic implementation plan to address a critical gap in the management of over 19,000 known orphan wells in all 32 Appalachian Ohio counties. The Ohio Natural Energy Institute aims to develop a workforce for orphan well-plugging and methane reduction by training former coal workers and other community members for work in environmental remediation. The initiative aims to alleviate the environmental degradation left by abandoned coal operations, turning potential hazards into opportunities for economic development through environmental restoration. The project will develop an industry-aligned orphan well-plugging curriculum and a strategic plan for transitioning the project into the implementation phase.

Project Title: *Appalachia Forge: Catalyzing Manufacturing Excellence in SE Ohio and WV*

Grantee: Collins Career Technical Center

Award Amount: \$46,900

Announcement Date: October 2024

Project Summary: ARC grant of \$46,900 to Collins Career Technical Center in Chesapeake, Ohio, for the *Appalachia Forge: Catalyzing Manufacturing Excellence in SE Ohio and WV* project. This project will create a strategic plan to develop the K-12 workforce pipeline to meet growing needs in advanced manufacturing and technology industries in seven counties in Southeast Ohio and West Virginia. Collins Career Center is planning to bolster their manufacturing center with upgraded equipment, larger capacity, and educational programs in areas such as mechatronics, robotic welding, and electrical and technology controls. The strategic plan will provide a clear roadmap for implementing an advanced manufacturing and technology program that maximizes impact on students' readiness and industry support.

Project Title: *Connecting Black Heritage, From Enslavement to Settlement in Southern Ohio*

Grantee: Tablertown People of Color Museum

Award Amount: \$40,427

Announcement Date: October 2024

Project Summary: ARC grant of \$40,427 to the Tablertown People of Color Museum in Stewart, Ohio, for the *Connecting Black Heritage, From Enslavement to Settlement in Southern Ohio* project. The project will develop a plan for a Heritage Trail that connects significant Underground Railroad and Black heritage sites across six Southeastern Ohio counties, with the goal of registering the sites with the National Park Service's "Network to Freedom" marker program. The plan also includes development of a virtual tour, displays and exhibits, and digital and print materials that can be used for teaching, training, and hosting events. The project expects to produce one plan, providing a roadmap for implementation that will connect tourists to places, artifacts, and activities in southeast Ohio that authentically represent the story of the Underground Railroad and related Black heritage.

Project Title: *Adena Works: Empowering Tomorrow's Makers*

Grantee: Adena Local School District

Award Amount: \$40,000

Announcement Date: October 2024

Project Summary: ARC grant of \$40,000 to Adena Local School District in Frankfort, Ohio, for the *Adena Works: Empowering Tomorrow's Makers* project. The project aims to create a transformative coalition of stakeholders, manufacturers, and other community entities that will identify the STEM workforce development and training needs of at-risk populations, including underserved, unemployed, substance-use-disorder-impacted, veterans, non-traditional, youth, and homeless populations. As a result of this project, Adena and their partners will develop three plans: a needs

assessment to identify local skill gaps, business needs, and workforce and training needs; a sustainability plan to identify strategies for cost efficiencies, leveraging resources, and training demands for a skilled labor workforce; and a strategic plan that will inform a future implementation plan, as well as the development of a manufacturing lab to provide STEM education for these at-risk populations.

PENNSYLVANIA (21 awards)

Project Title: *ClearWater Community Conservation Center Ecotourism, Agritourism, and Agribusiness Hub*

Grantee: ClearWater Conservancy

Award Amount: \$2,000,000

Announcement Date: October 2024

Project Summary: ARC grant of \$2,000,000 to the ClearWater Conservancy in State College, Pennsylvania, for the *ClearWater Community Conservation Center Ecotourism, Agritourism, and Agribusiness Hub* project. The project includes construction of a new, 9,350-square-foot community center in Centre County, which will serve as a community space and hub for visitor information and local conservation efforts. The center will include a visitor information kiosk, training opportunities for businesses in agritourism and conservation best practices, guided tours for visitors to local natural assets, mine land reclamation and acid mine drainage remediation efforts, and development of local trails through the Conservancy's Rothrock Trail Alliance. The project expects to create five new jobs and draw thousands of new visitors to the Center by 2029.

Project Title: *Ironworks Square: Smart Redevelopment in Coal-Impacted Regions*

Grantee: Enterprise Development Center of Erie County, Inc.

Award Amount: \$2,000,000

Announcement Date: October 2024

Project Summary: ARC grant of \$2,000,000 to the Enterprise Development Center of Erie County, Inc. in Erie, Pennsylvania, for the *Ironworks Square: Smart Redevelopment in Coal-Impacted Regions* project. This project will redevelop a 60,000-square-foot warehouse, vacated by a steel manufacturer in 2001, into mixed-use and light industrial office space. This development will serve as a catalyst for growth by attracting new businesses, creating new jobs, and helping cultivate a resilient economic base. The grantee expects the new site to serve five businesses, create three businesses, improve five businesses, and create 40 jobs over the span of three years.

Project Title: *Pennsylvania Career Pathways to Advanced Manufacturing: "Forging Your Future"*

Grantee: Catalyst Connection

Award Amount: \$2,000,000

Announcement Date: October 2024

Project Summary: ARC grant of \$2,000,000 to Catalyst Connection in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, for the *Pennsylvania Career Pathways to Advanced Manufacturing: "Forging Your Future"* project. This three-step project will build a pipeline of qualified

workers for advanced manufacturing opportunities in 12 counties through: 1) a new "Explore the New Manufacturing" pre-internship program for students from low-income or coal-impacted areas; 2) a new "Making Your Future" internship program, in which students will participate in full-time, paid, on-the-job training for registered apprenticeships; and 3) a new "Manufacturing Learning Labs," where participants will receive hands-on training at a state-of-the-art manufacturing training facility. Through a partnership with Scott County Telephone Cooperative (SCTC), four dedicated fibers are being provided as the in-kind match through a 10-year indefeasible right to use, valued at \$3,256,921. This will provide a 226.2-mile route of fiber that will upgrade speeds to 800Gbps through nine communities in Southwest Virginia and Northeast Tennessee. As a result of this project, three business are anticipated to be served, 40 permanent technology jobs created, and two new data centers developed.

Project Title: *Southwest Virginia Creative Economy Assessment and Development*

This project aims to achieve long-term economic success for the 12 gateway towns in eight counties surrounding the Monongahela National Forest by advancing the local
