PROJECT SUMMARY

Trust for Public Land (TPL) will use ARISE funding to connect 262 counties in eight Appalachian states with the potential of their outdoor recreation economies. This project will help communities prioritize impactful outdoor recreation projects, coordinate technical assistance with 100 of these communities, and offer direct assistance to up to 32 of these counties to advance implementation projects to completion. The project will also create recreation management plans for the eight states involved.

TPL and partners bring a combined \$8,386,649 in matching funds to this project. The project will serve 2,000 participants in 125 communities and will result in 15 plans and reports by the end of the five-year performance period.
